Remaining hrs. needed to complete the 120 hrs. required by the College of Liberal Arts for a B.A. degree (24 or 21 hours, depending on whether 9 or 12 hours are used to satisfy the foreign language requirement). These remaining hours may include courses in English, Journalism, or any other department.

Reminders: Successful completion of ENGL 1158 is a prerequisite for all English courses numbered 2000 and above. Successful completion of 45 hrs. of coursework, including 6 hrs. of 2000-level literature courses, is a prerequisite for all English courses numbered 3000 and above.
