### **Approval of Minutes**

### Guest Speaker: Marlana Fireman – United Campus Workers

- Graduate student and TA in Liberal Arts
- Member of UNO Branch of United Campus Workers
- The union is a part of a larger branch of unions across Louisiana, including LSU
- We have 183 members statewide and 55 at UNO.

### Some of our wins:

- At UNO, we ut pressure on upper administration to step in when a supervisor in enrollment services wasn't doing their job, hiding documents, which resulted in thousands of applications not being processed
- Successfully increased the minimum wage for student workers
- In Tennessee we stopped facilities from being outsourced

### Some of our goals:

- A concrete timeline on when things will be address/fixed
- Replacing staff and faculty positions that are vacant instead of a top heavy situation
- Wage increases that match inflation
- Creating working relationships across campus and departments
- Transparency with fees

### Ways we connect:

- Organization committee meetings every other friday
- Regular lunches
- Hoping for a general meeting in the near future

### **Executive Committee Reports**

- 1. **Governor's Paid Parental Leave**: The governor signed an order to allow state workers 6 weeks of paid parental leave. Technically higher education aren't part of this policy, but universities across the state are drafting policies to align with the state. We will have HR speak on this once the dust settles
- 2. **Faculty Senate**: There was a spirited debate about the budget for athletics last year. The tl;dr is that athletics overspent their budget by 2ish million, much of the overage coming from general funds.
  - i. The old process was that athletics would request a budget increase, and Dr. Nicklow would approve it. Now, changes to budgets are sent to Business Affairs where they will make a data driven decision.

### Addendum: Faculty Senate Notes

Question about athletic budget - VP of academic affairs and Tim Duncan to speak on that

Is it true athletics overran their budget last year 2022-2023? Yes.

Background: at each budget request, the president would approve them and increase their budget Starting budget: 8 mil, which was reduced to 7.something, ended up spending 8.9 mil. Athletics was not the only department to overrun their budget

When Dr. O'Rourke came in, those requests would go to business affairs, and budget investigations would happen before something was approved.

Goal is to put together quarterly budget reports

We don't have monthly dashboards

Vp was critical of Dr. Nicklow approving things without having the data

How was the overage covered?

4.2% from general fund

135k from aux fund (believe to be a sponsorship)

Privateer spirit fee

350k from foundation account

100k from fundraising

The rest came from HERF / care funds

Current budget for Athletics is 7.7 mil for this year

In the past we've budgeted based on 2.5% increase in enrollment each year. We don't have a proper budgeting strategy. Now we budgeting is happening 2-3 years out instead of 1 year so we're not just reacting Dr. Nicklow believed that Tim could fund the program based on fundraising skills

### From Tim Duncan:

Raised privately 3-400k in corporate sponsorships

350k - privately raised funds

500k raised a year where our basketball team has to play specific teams (michigan, ohio) just to fund the program

3.5% of the uni budget for athletics - so enrollment affects us just like other departments, but we can't fix when we project wrongly

### Where the money was spent:

- Salaries (we asked about furloughs and were denied)
- Scholarships (can't be re-negged)
- Operations (we're in the bus and hotel business, we have to have uniforms and feed them, and bring them to games)

**Question:** How much of general fund money was supposed to be spent: **4.2 mil** How much WAS spend: **6.5 mil** 

• We replaced a women's basketball coach

Question: What are the new hires for Athletics?

- Lost a head of marketing, tim duncan took
- Lost head of corporate sponsorship, tim took that role
- We filled people at lower salaries
- Went 2 years without an exec assistant (only brand new position)
