PURPOSE

To ensure all educational programs and courses offered through consortial and contractual agreements meet university requirements.

AUTHORITY

Part Two, Chapter I, Section VII and VIII; Chapter III, Section IV of the Bylaws and Rules of the University of Louisiana System.

GENERAL POLICY

The University of New Orleans has articulation and cross-enrollment agreements with Delgado Community College, Nunez Community College, the Louisiana State University Medical Center School of Nursing and Southern University in New Orleans, all of which are accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools. Any other SACSCOC accredited institution of higher learning in the State of Louisiana that wishes to develop articulation and cross-enrollment agreements with the University of New Orleans must formally request such an agreement through the Office of the President. Similarly, if the University of New Orleans initiates articulation and cross-enrollments agreements, they will be subject to the provisions of this policy.

PROCEDURE

The University will regularly review all articulation and cross enrollment agreements by appropriate faculty, staff and administrators appointed by the Associate Provost for Academic Programs. The committee will be comprised of appropriate faculty who will develop measurement criteria which will ensure all courses meet the University's academic standards. In addition, the University will from time to time ask UNO faculty to review courses from their discipline to ensure that each course meets the University's academic standards.
