One Drive for Business

OneDrive is a cloud (Internet-based) service which offers a simple and secure way for storing, syncing, and sharing files. The system allows you to organize your files in folders and to access them as needed, from anywhere.

You may have heard of the free storage service provided by OneDrive and other similar systems. **OneDrive for Business**, is a similar but more powerful storage system and, as the name indicates, is intended for business purposes by providing more data security as well as document sharing and collaboration options. OneDrive for Business and Office 365 make it easy to manage your work files, share them, and collaborate with others from anywhere. This application is preinstalled on Windows 10 and Office 2016, and it works great on all mobile devices. You can access and share files and photos on a PC, Mac, Android and IOs devices.

UNO provides every employee with all the benefits of OneDrive including back up tools that allow IT to protect important company data. The system is managed by UNO IT under the Microsoft licensing agreement and provides each user with 1TB of available space. It is expected that in the near future OneDrive for Business will eventually replace your UNO I- and S-drives.

Privateer Alerts

UNO Public Relations recently announced the renaming of UNO's emergency notification system from E2campus to *Privateer Alerts*. The change in



name also comes with two new important technical features: It is now much easier to sign up for the first time or to manage your account using

your current UNO email and password. If you sign into <u>https://myapps.uno.edu</u> with your UNO email and password, you will see a new tile marked "Privateer Alerts." Click on the tile and enter your information. It takes less than 30 seconds to enroll, and it will ensure that you receive critical emergency information from the University.

During the past few days, Information Technology has been deploying a new feature called *Desktop Alerts* which will provide another layer of communication (besides texts, emails, and public monitors) by

displaying emergency notifications (communicated by UNO Police or Public Relations) on Windows and Mac desktops across



campus. The app itself is a very small client that runs in the system tray on Windows and in the "Menu Bar" on Mac OS.

Research Computing

UNO is a member of the Louisiana Optical Network Initiative (LONI) and an Affiliate Member of UCAID (Internet 2). LONI is a state-of-the-art, fiber optics network that runs throughout Louisiana, and connects Louisiana and Mississippi research universities to one another as well as to the National LambdaRail and Internet2. Through LONI, researchers have access to one of the most powerful supercomputing resources available to any academic community with over 85 teraflops of computational capacity from systems based at Louisiana universities. In addition, LONI provides access to the TeraGrid community, the world's largest, most comprehensive distributed cyber infrastructure for open scientific research. Through our association with LONI, Internet2 (I2) at 1 Gigabit/ sec, and National Lambda Rail at 10 Gigabit/sec (for Supercomputer clustering and Grid based computing support).




