LSUHSC - New Orleans Nursing Program

Listed below are the prerequisite courses for admission to the Bachelor of Science in Nursing Program at the LSU Health Sciences Center School of Nursing in New Orleans.

Program requirements are determined by LSUHSC. Admission to the program is on a competitive basis.

Applicants must have a minimum GPA of 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale) on all pre-nursing courses. A grade of B or better must be achieved in all science pre-nursing courses. A grade of C or better must be achieved in all non-science prerequisites. If a student receives a D or F in a pre-nursing course, it may be repeated only once. Failure of any pre-nursing course twice makes an applicant ineligible for admission.

Applicants must complete 37 hours of required prerequisite courses. Of the 37 required hours, only 16 of those hours (below) must be completed prior to the application deadline and appear on the applicant's official transcript. The remaining pre-requisite courses may be in progress at the time the application is submitted. All official transcripts are required.



LSU School of Nursing Admission Requirements

- 1. Completion of the 37 hours of listed courses with a G.P.A. of at least a 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale). A grade of C or better must be achieved in all non-science pre-requisite courses and a grade of B or better must be achieved in all science pre-requisite courses (Biology lecture, Biology lab, Microbiology, and Chemistry
- 2. The HESI Admission Assessment exam A² from Evolve Testing & Remediation is required. The exam must be taken by the application deadline. A minimum cumulative score of 80% is required. An applicant may take the HESI Exam twice during an application period and must wait six (6) weeks between exams. LSU Health New Orleans - School of Nursing will take the most recent score. The applicant must re-test if the latest score is greater than one (1) year. LSU Health New Orleans - School of Nursing code is 198306.
- 3. The School of Nursing at LSU Health New Orleans School or Nursing participates in a Centralized Application Service for Nursing Programs (NursingCAS). The traditional BSN program admits students in the fall and spring each year. The fall semester application deadline is mid-January. The spring semester application deadline is the beginning of August. Please visit the NursingCAS website to complete the on-line NursingCAS application at https://www.nursingcas.org/.
