And I again, I'd reiterate like, it's hard for our non traditional students or students who work all day or, you know, the library's open only till six o'clock, and that's really a problem.

Yeah, so Jullianne Romero, President. I asked at a previous meeting, I'm not sure if it was the last one. I don't think I did. But the one before, and basically the answer they gave me was based on their statistics and algorithms or something that that's the hours that people go to the library. I kind of feel, and I can bring it up again, I'll bug them until they fix something. the answer was that and I feel like Well, yeah, people only go during that time because that's the only times it is open. And it seems it seems kind of odd to me that they didn't expect as many people on campus since they haven't like they keep pushing for us to get back on campus with like this. You know, after Mardi Gras, they're wanting us back on campus, even though things are ramping up with the virus, and they haven't closed like the dorms or anything. So it just it seems rather short sighted given that they've pushed everything for people to be on campus, or kind of

Brendan Mott, when I did work there, it was not filled to capacity we had on most of our suites had two to three people in them rather than all four. They tried to make it to where most suites would only have two people as opposed to four. But some they had to add an extra person to fill it up. But it was never completely full.

Gotcha. So what I'm getting at is, is folks who are in their dorms during the hours that the library is open, we're not seeing them. I know I didn't when I went in a few times, which was during a lunch hour that we typically would have that, that timeframe off before the next class. And then I went at five o'clock, right before they closed, and i also went nine o'clock the next morning, just to see how it goes. I wasn't seeing a whole lot of people there. So I don't know if it's because those are work hours for most of our students, I know we are a commuter campus. That could also be something that our administrators are looking at, too. I just went personally to see what's the, you know, what's the hype in the in the library during COVID? They have really been very aware of it. I mean, it feels so empty.

When I went in there. A lot of the computers are not in use right now. A lot of the rooms are just like storage rooms right now. So it's a it's a lot of things that I know administration is taking into account when it comes to when will the library be open and how long? I'm sure the cost factor also comes into play for them. We don't know really, offhand how much it's costing them to run the school during this time, so we just have to be aware of all of those things as well.
