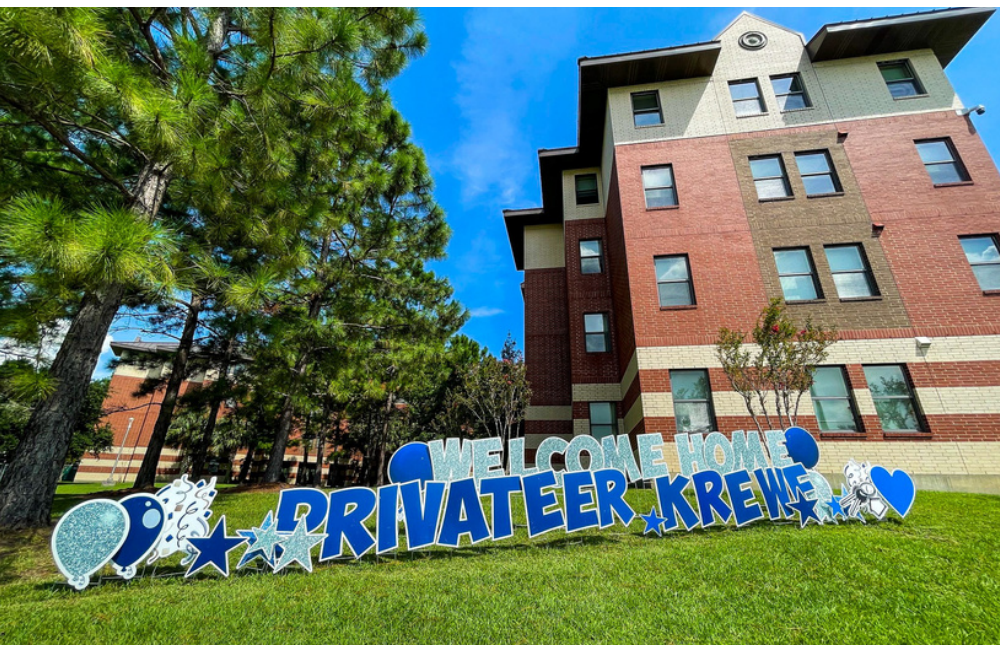

COVID-19 TESTING REQUIRED BEFORE MOVE-IN

All residents must submit a negative Covid-19 test at move-in. PCR Tests taken within 72 hours of move in are recommended, however, the Office of Residential Life plans to have rapid tests available at check-in as needed. Residents are encouraged to be fully vaccinated against Covid-19 and receive boosters as recommended by the Centers for Disease Control. Please visit uno.edu/covid-19 for updates.

PRE- ARRIVAL CHECK-LIST

- Log in to your Residential Life app to review your roommates and room assignment.
- Communicate with your Roommates about your expectations for living together for the semester. Complete the roommate agreement form available on the Residential Life app.
- Register your electronic devices via the Resnet Process. Link available at uno.edu/housing/maintenance-request.
- Register your bicycle on the Residential app. Vehicles must be registered for a residential parking decal each semester; vehicle decals can be picked up at Computer Center 221 between 8:00 am- 4 pm MWThF; On Tuesdays, the Parking Office is available 9:30 a- 5:30 p.m.
- Review emails for any important updates from UNO and Residential Life.
- Review the Pontchartrain Hall Handbook and Housing Agreement for all policies available at uno.edu/housing.
- Follow the Office of Residential Life on social media.

Frequently Asked Questions

1. Can I Move In Later than January 28?

If you are unable to move-in between January 20-28 between 9 am- 4 pm, please email ResidentialLife@uno.edu to notify our office of your alternative date.

2. What should I do to plan my arrival on campus?

Please be on time. Your check-in time is for you to retrieve your key, complete our check-in paperwork, and have your ID programmed by an Office of Residential Life staff member at the front desk of your hall. Limit your guests to assist with move-in to a maximum of 2 assistants. All persons entering Pontchartrain Halls must wear a mask or facial covering and observe physical distancing policies.

3. I need to get a UNO ID card. How do I get one?

The ID Card Office will be open Monday- Friday between the hours of 9 am- 4 pm on the first floor of the Computer Center Building next to the Earl K Long Library for students to pick up their ID.

4. Where do I pick up mail and packages on campus?

There is a post office located on campus. You must set up a mailbox with them. They are located in the University Center. There is also a post office box rental fee associated with mailbox set up. Please do not send mail to the halls, as it will be sent back.

5. What if my roommates and I do not work out?

You are highly encouraged to complete the Roommate Agreement posted to your Residential Life app before beginning a roommate relationship as the items discussed during the Roommate Agreement process will assist in building a strong roommate relationship and understanding. Be open and honest during this discussion. If you are still having issues, contact your RA for assistance with mediation. If the issues are unable to be resolved via mediation, contact the Residential Life professional staff at ResidentialLife@uno.edu for additional assistance.

6. What should I bring into my suite?

2-4 person occupancy rooms need extra long twin bedding. Single occupancy rooms need full sized bedding. Each room has a bed, desk, chair & closet for each student. Bathrooms are 2 person shared use, except in single occupancy rooms.

BED and BATH ACCEPTABLE ITEMS: Pillows • Mattress Covers • Foam Pillow Mattress Toppers • Shower Mats • Bath Mats • Towels Wash Cloths • Shower Curtain & Liner • Shower Caddy • Area Rugs • Plunger • Bathroom Trash Container • Cleaning Supplies

LAUNDRY, KITCHEN and STORAGE ACCEPTABLE ITEMS: Clothes Hamper • Clothes Hangers • Shoe Bins • Organizers • Closet Organizers Storage Bins & Baskets [Plastic, Metal or Wire] • Plates • Bowls • Cups • Silverware • Laundry Detergent • Dish Detergent • Dish Sponge • Trashcan

WALL ORGANIZATION, PICTURES and DECOR: 3M Command Strips • 3M Command Hooks [Nails, Tape and Tacks are Not Permitted]

ELECTRONICS and APPLIANCES: Laptop • Desktop • Tablet • Smart Phone • Chargers • Electronic Devices & Accessories Ethernet Cords • Power Strips • TV's [Wall Mounts are Not Permitted] • Small Microwave • Mini Fridge [Smaller than 5 cubic feet] • Keurig Type Coffee Maker

7. What should I NOT bring into my suite?

All smoking, vaping, illegal narcotics and weapons are prohibited on UNO Campus. Items marked with an (*) asterisk are prohibited by the Fire Marshall.

Coffee Makers [Except Keurig's] • Hot Plates • Anything with a exposed Heating Element/Hot Surface • Air Fryer • Regular Size Refrigerators • Space Heaters • Christmas Lights* • String Lights* • All Furniture • Curtains* • All Wall Plug Air Fresheners • Mattresses [Unless Approved by the Office of Disability Services] • Regular Extension Cords [Except Power Strips] • Candles • Incense Burner • Incense Wax Warmers • Vaping Device • Vaping Supplies • All Smoking Paraphernalia Illegal Drugs & Drug Paraphernalia • Alcohol [If Under 21] • All Weapons • Pets
