#### **PURPOSE**

The purpose of this policy is to create a comprehensive definition of the term “student” for policy and student code of conduct enforcement. For the purposes of student records, refer to [AP-AA-12 FERPA Compliance](#).

#### **AUTHORITY**

*Part Two, Chapter II, Section XIX of the bylaws and rules of the University of Louisiana System regarding Student Conduct.*

#### **GENERAL POLICY**

The student code of conduct and other campus policies apply to the conduct of individual students, both undergraduate and graduate, and all University affiliated student organizations. For the purposes of policy enforcement, unless otherwise defined differently in specific policies, the University considers an individual to be a “student” when an offer of admission has been extended and thereafter as long as the student has a continuing educational interest in the University. The term “student” includes individuals who are dually or concurrently enrolled, visiting/guest, online, and/or non-degree seeking.

Individuals enrolled in the Link to Success Program partnership with Nunez Community College and individuals participating in UNO study abroad programs are also considered UNO students for the purposes of this policy.

Students who take a leave of absence, withdraw, or graduate, are considered students for the purposes of university policy enforcement for any misconduct that occurred prior to the leave, withdrawal, or graduation.

Individuals who attend post-secondary educational institutions other than the University of New Orleans and who reside on campus at UNO are also accountable for abiding by University policy and the student code of conduct.
