Item F.4. University of New Orleans' request for approval of Memoranda of Understanding between the New Orleans Center for Creative Arts Culinary program (NOCCA – Culinary Arts) and the Lester E. Kabacoff School of Hotel, Restaurant and Tourism Administration at the University (UNO-HRT program).

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Full-Day Program:

Graduates of the NOCCA Culinary Arts program earn a Certificate of Artistry or Achievement in Culinary Arts upon the successful completion of four years of coursework at NOCCA.

This MOU establishes a clear pathway for NOCCA Culinary Arts program graduates to seamlessly transition into the UNO-HRT program, facilitating the transfer of credits earned during their NOCCA coursework.

Under this agreement, NOCCA Culinary Arts graduates holding certificates are eligible to receive up to 30 credit hours within the UNO-HRT program. The specific UNO courses eligible for credit transfer are detailed in the MOU.

To enhance the strength of this collaboration, both programs have devised engagement activities for their respective student bodies. NOCCA Culinary Arts students partake in a semesterly tour of the UNO-HRT program, which includes comprehensive presentations on the HRT program, UNO Admissions/Financial Aid, and culminates in culinary and classroom demonstrations, offering a firsthand experience of a day in the life of a UNO-HRT student. As a reciprocal gesture, UNO-HRT actively participates in NOCCA Culinary Arts career days, engaging with students on campus and contributing to their classroom activities.

This MOU not only solidifies the academic connection between NOCCA's Culinary Arts program and UNO's HRT program, but also fosters a meaningful exchange of insights and experiences between the two student communities.

Half-Day Program:

Under this agreement, students enroll in the NOCCA Culinary Arts program as half-day participants while maintaining their home high school affiliation. Successful completion of the NOCCA Culinary Arts program as half-day students earns them a Certificate of Artistry or Achievement in Culinary Arts.

Students in the Half-Day program may transfer a maximum of 30 credit hours to the UNO-HRT program. These credits encompass 13 hours from the NOCCA Culinary Arts curriculum, supplemented by eligible credit hours from their respective home high schools.

The remaining provisions of this MOU mirror those outlined in the Full-Day student MOU.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the following resolution be adopted:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Supervisors for the University of Louisiana System hereby approves the MOUs between NOCCA-Culinary Arts and the UNO-HRT program.

Item F.5. University of Louisiana System's request for approval of System Universities' 2023-24 Promotions in Faculty Rank and Recommendations for Tenure.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Annually each UL System campus submits recommendations for promotions in faculty rank and tenure. This year, 143 faculty members were recommended for promotion in rank, with 97 faculty members recommended for tenure.

With respect to promotion in rank, 47 faculty members across the UL System were recommended for promotion to the rank of Professor and 96 to the rank of Associate Professor. Our review suggests that the recommended faculty met all respective guidelines.

A total of 97 faculty members across the UL System were recommended for tenure and rationales were provided for the 5 faculty members to whom "early" tenure was recommended (i.e., before the six-year probationary term). In these cases, exceptions were considered based on outstanding performance and/or early tenure review was a condition of acceptance of employment. Board policy provides for such exceptions.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the following resolution be adopted:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Supervisors for the University of Louisiana System hereby approves System Universities' 2023-24 Promotions in Faculty Rank and Recommendations for Tenure.

Item J.2. University of New Orleans' request for approval to convert the Jack and Reba Matthey Endowed Chair in Engineering into four Endowed Professorships.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Jack and Reba Matthey Endowed Chair in Engineering was established with a contribution of \$600,000 from contributions from Jack and Reba Matthey and a LABoRSF match of \$400,000. The Chair is expected to be vacated on July 1, 2024, and the University now believes that the Dr. Robert A. Savoie College of Engineering would be best served by converting the Endowed Chair into four Endowed Professorships, with each professorship assigned a \$250,000 endowment.

Since 1999, the Chair has supported a single professor in Mechanical Engineering associated with the Energy Conversion and Conservation Center (ECCC) and the Electric Power Research Institute (EPRI). The original expectation of the two Centers was for the Centers to grow over time, but the EPRI has been discontinued and the ECCC is now winding down its research efforts.

The faculty are now engaged in research around renewable energy and offshore wind development, as well as emergency preparedness and the use of artificial intelligence as a tool for the management of the power grid. It would, therefore, be to the College's advantage to have Professorships that could respond to these changes. The Endowed Professorships would support energy-related initiatives within the College of Engineering and not be limited to mechanical engineering, acknowledging the complexity of this interdisciplinary field.

The conversion of the Chair into four Professorships broadens the impact of the Chair's endowment by expanding support for the College's research and teaching mission. By broadening the Chair's impact, the conversion also continues advancing the economic development in Louisiana, one of the Chair's original purposes.

The four Endowed Professorships would be named as follows:

- Jack and Reba Matthey Endowed Professor I in Engineering
- Jack and Reba Matthey Endowed Professor II in Engineering
- Jack and Reba Matthey Endowed Professor of Practice I in Engineering
- Jack and Reba Matthey Endowed Professor of Practice II in Engineering

Item J.3. University of New Orleans' request for approval to repurpose and rename the Urban Waste Management Endowed Professorship in Civil Engineering.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Urban Waste Management Professorship in Civil Engineering has been unoccupied since 2020 when the faculty member left the institution. UNO now requests the focus of the Professorship be broadened. The faculty in the Department of Civil and Environmental Engineering represent diverse areas of expertise, including environmental, water resources, geotechnical, and structural engineering. The current professorship is unique and does not have the flexibility required in today's environment. The criteria would be broadened to focus on urban issues, not just urban waste. This repurpose would advance the overall contributions of the Department's programs to the urban environment, while still honoring the original intent of the Professorship.

In addition, UNO requests to change the name of the Professorship to the *Endowed Professorship in Urban Civil Engineering*. The institution sees the title change as a better reflection of the revised focus of the Professorship.

RECOMMENDATION

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Supervisors for the University of Louisiana System hereby approves University of New Orleans' request for approval to rename the Urban Waste Management Endowed Professorship in Civil Engineering to the Endowed Professorship in Urban Civil Engineering.
