## BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN URBAN STUDIES & PLANNING



Historic New Orleans is a living laboratory for anyone wanting to learn about Urban Studies and Planning. In this degree we examine urban life.

- How do cities and urban regions work?
- What drives economic growth?
- How can we make cities just and sustainable?
- What influences the construction of houses and other infrastructure?
- How do economic drivers such as international trade and the Port of New Orleans support our vibrant tourism industry and streetcar development?

Students who complete the program seek entry-level positions in public, private and non-profit sector organizations. They will also be prepared for urban and environmental professional or scholarly graduate degree programs in Urban Studies, Urban and Regional Planning, Transportation or related disciplines.

### PROGRAM OBJECTIVE

The Bachelor of Science in Urban Studies and Planning degree is an interdisciplinary program that provides students with a holistic approach to the study of the urban environment. Students examine the historical, cultural, social, economic, and environmental aspects of urban areas. Students have the opportunity of selecting an optional concentration in urban planning, transportation, or geography

### ACCELERATED MASTERS DEGREES

The Accelerated Master's Degree (**BSUSP/MURP** or **BSUSP/MST**) offers the opportunity for outstanding students to begin earning credit toward a master's degree while still pursuing undergraduate studies. The accelerated programs allow a student to complete a master's in less time and at a lower-than-average cost. The main feature of the program is that, while completing their undergraduate study, students may earn up to 12 semester hours of graduate credit that counts as dual credit for both the baccalaureate and master's degrees.
