K-12 AI Infrastructure Program

Notice seeking proposals to produce public goods that enable a wide variety of products and services to provide high-quality formative assessment to every student, with particular attention to the needs of U.S. students furthest from opportunity, thereby accelerating student success in multiple K-12 subject areas. The public goods will be licensed resources that can be broadly used and incorporated—directly or indirectly—by developers of AI-enabled tools and infrastructure for K-12 education, in order to improve the technology products that teachers and students rely on.

Proposals are due March 8, 2026. Awards range from \$50,000 - \$250,000. For institutions with less than 2,000 staff, one proposal may be submitted per track, for institutions with more than 2,000 staff each department may submit one proposal.

Mozilla Foundation Incubator: Democracy x AI

Notice seeking proposals from technologists building working technologies with demonstrated traction. Ideally, projects have moved beyond prototype and leverage AI as a core capability. Projects must aim to strengthen democratic practice in one of three categories: 1) enable better information; 2) build institutional transparency and accountability; and 3) protect and expand civic space.

Strengthening Community Colleges Training Grants Round 6

Notice seeking applications from community colleges to focus on building program and system capacity for implementing and scaling access to short-term training opportunities through Workforce Pell Grants.

American Neurotology Society Research Grant Award

Notice seeking applications to encourage and support academic research in sciences related to the investigation of otology and neurotology. Appropriate areas of research include diagnosis, management, and pathogenesis of diseases of the ear and/or skull base. Awards are made to an Institution on behalf of a Grantee.

Applications are due March 2, 2026 (electronically only). The maximum award request is \$25,000 per year (US dollars) and is annually renewable on a competitive basis. Funds are distributed in two payments of \$12,500 in July and December.

Critical Illness Immunological Reprogramming and Control Point Learning Engine (CIRCLE)

Notice seeking proposals for projects that lead to improvement in intensive care unit health outcomes. the CIRCLE program seeks to obtain targeted near real-time patient data: tissue-specific and system (patient) assessments of critical illness immuno-inflammation biomarkers. These data will be used to define novel control points through validated computational digital twin models of critical illness that will direct personalized immunotherapy. This transformative program will expand our understanding, diagnosis, prognosis, and treatment of critical illness driven by diverse causes, ultimately also impacting chronic disease that is induced or exacerbated by critical illness.

Required solution summaries are due March 30, 2026. Full proposals are due May 29, 2026. Multiple awards are anticipated.

2026 Wood Innovations Grant Funding Opportunity
