Notice seeking applications to support humanistic engagement on what it means to live in moments that are marked by precarity, fragility, and catastrophe. What might it mean to flourish in a world on the brink of extinction or exhaustion? Survival can be individual or collective, shaped by cultural imperatives, ideological commitments, or existential negotiations in the face of political, economic, environmental, social, and technological upheavals.

Applications are due September 22, 2025. Fellowships of \$64,000 will be awarded. Applicants must have received their PhD before January 1, 2025, and must also have at least one year of teaching experience, which may include teaching as a graduate student.

FY2025 ABPP - Battlefield Interpretation Grant

Aging Mammalian Tissues In Vitro (R21 Clinical Trial Not Allowed)

Mucosal Immunology Studies Team (MIST) (U01 Clinical Trial Not Allowed)

Rapid Response: Reinvesting in Racial and Indigenous Health Equity Research
