Fulbright U.S. Scholar Program

The Fulbright U.S. Scholar Program features awards for scholars, artists, and professionals at all career stages. Postdoctoral Awards provide recently graduated scholars an opportunity to conduct research and receive professional training abroad. Awards may involve limited teaching. Postdoctoral Awards are open to scholars who will have received a doctoral degree (Ph.D., J.D., M.D., Ed.D., etc.) within five to seven years of the fellowship start date, as noted in the award description. Degree conferment before the start of the award is mandatory. Institutional affiliation in the United States is not required.

Fulbright U.S. Scholar Application Deadline is **September 15, 2025 5:00 PM EDT (UTC-4:00)**.

Louisiana Coastal Protection and Restoration Authority (CPRA)

The Louisiana Coastal Protection and Restoration Authority (CPRA) continues its support of a graduate assistantship opportunity called the Coastal Science Assistantship Program (CSAP). This program provides graduate assistant stipends for up to three years to Master of Science students both enrolled full-time at Louisiana colleges/universities and involved in research relevant to Louisiana coastal protection and restoration efforts (see: [THE MASTER PLAN - Coastal Protection and Restoration Authority of Louisiana](#)). The program will both expose students to CPRA activities and provide a potential avenue for recruitment of new CPRA personnel. Students recruited under this assistantship program will be required to complete 240 hours of internship with CPRA at mutually convenient times during their pursuit of a master's degree.

Applications from faculty must be submitted via LSG's online eSeaGrant system by 1 December 2025; a decision on award of the assistantships will be made by CPRA by the end of January 2026. Funding should be available 1 June 2026 and students must be enrolled by August 2026.
