### Collections Grants

Notice seeking letters of inquiry which supports efforts of organizations to re-interpret and re-present their permanent collections. Grants offset planning, research, and/or implementation costs for permanent collection reinstallations or temporary exhibitions drawn primarily from an institution's permanent collection.

Letters of Inquiry are due August 4, 2025. Planning grants typically range between \$25,000 and \$75,000 and Implementation grants are up to \$100,000. Eligibility is limited to applicants who hold United States 501(c)(3) tax-exempt status or its international equivalent.
