Holberg Prize invites nominations for outstanding researchers

Notice seeking nominations for the annual Holberg Prize. The prize may be awarded for work within a particular academic discipline and for work of a cross-disciplinary nature.

Nominations are due June 15, 2025. Approximately \$582,000 annual prize is available to recognize outstanding individual contributions to the humanities, social sciences, law, and theology. Anyone holding an academic position at a university, academy or other research institution may nominate candidates for the Holberg Prize.

EDUCATION and ECONOMIC & COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

FY 2025 Competitive Academic Agreement Program (CAAP)

Notice seeking proposals for research pursuing innovative solutions for five topics in pipeline safety and integrity challenge areas. PHMSA's 2025 CAAP focuses on research and development (R&D) are 1) Risk evaluation of vehicle strikes on aboveground pipeline equipment and facilities; 2) Technology, equipment, or procedures to prevent human error; 3) Testing, modeling, and verifying strain capacity in vintage pipelines 4) Non-metallic pipe inspection technology; 5) Acceptable methods for modeling shrouding or obstructions for pressurized liquid releases (liquefied natural gas).

Proposals are due June 20, 2025. An estimated \$2 million is available to fund two or more awards over 12 to 26 months. Cost share of 20 percent is required.

FY2025 Commercial Motor Vehicle Operator Safety Training Program (CMVOST)

Notice seeking applications to train individuals in the safe operation of commercial motor vehicles. This program will prioritize applications that train current or former members of the U.S. Armed Forces, including National Guard and Reservists.

Applications are due June 20, 2025. 25 awards are anticipated. The maximum amount for awards is \$200,000.

Notice seeking applications to support innovative and impactful projects that advance its mission to reduce crashes, injuries, and fatalities involving large trucks and buses. Applications are due June 20, 2025. An estimated \$46.6 million is available to fund up to 30 awards.

DoD Prostate Cancer, Clinical Consortium Award

Notice seeking applications to support projects to develop, maintain, and enhance the necessary collaborations and resources to rapidly execute phase 2 and/or phase 2-linked phase 1 (phase1/2) prostate cancer clinical trials. The primary intent of the PCRCP Clinical Consortium Award is to combine the efforts of leading investigators across multiple institutions to expedite the clinical advancement of novel therapeutic interventions in prostate cancer to decrease the impact of the disease.

Required pre-applications are due August 8, 2025. One coordinating center will be selected, and multiple clinical research sites will be supported under this award, with maximum direct cost award amounts of \$1.4 million.

DoD Prostate Cancer, Idea Development Award

Notice seeking applications for new ideas that represent innovative approaches to prostate cancer research and have the potential to make an important contribution to the Prostate Cancer Research Program (PCRCP) mission. All applications are required to address one or more of the FY25 PCRCP overarching challenges. An additional category to support new investigators is also available.

Required pre-applications are due August 8, 2025. Applications are due August 29, 2025. An estimated \$19.2 million is available to fund 10 awards with maximum direct costs of \$1.2 million or \$1.5 million depending on the category.

RFP for Target Grants program

Notice seeking applications aimed at finding a cure for HIV that will be useful to the 40 million people living with HIV (PLWH). Target Grants should focus on pushing the boundaries of biomedical research to achieve sustained HIV remission or complete viral eradication. Priority will be given to clinical or pre-clinical applications studying pragmatic and scalable interventions that can be implemented globally, including in the communities most affected by the epidemic.

Applications are due June 18, 2025. Grants of up to \$480,000 is available with 20% indirect costs.

Trailblazer Cancer Research Grants for Early-Stage Investigators Grant program

Notice seeking applications to empower and support cancer researchers, help launch their careers, and enable them to become thought leaders in the field. These grants are intended to advance the understanding of cancer biology, drive groundbreaking translational discoveries, and/or improve patient outcomes.

Required letters of intent are due June 12, 2025. An estimated \$1 million over three years is available.

SCIENCE, TECHNOLOGY, ENGINEERING, and MATHEMATICS

Centers of Research Excellence in Science and Technology - Research Infrastructure for Science and Engineering

Notice seeking proposals that supports the expansion of institutional research capacity by increasing the strength of institutional graduate programs and the successful production of research doctoral students, especially those from groups underrepresented in STEM.

Proposals are due August 1, 2025. An estimated \$6 million is available to fund up to nine awards.

Fiscal Year 2024 Fire Prevention and Safety (FP&S) Grant Program

Notice seeking applications for projects to enhance the safety of the public and firefighters with respect to fire and fire-related hazards. The FP&S Program offers grants to support activities in two categories: (1) activities designed to reach high-risk target groups and mitigate incidences of death and injuries caused by fire and fire-related hazards ("Fire Prevention and Safety Activity") and (2) research and development activities aimed at improving firefighter safety ("Firefighter Safety Research and Development Activity").

Applications are due July 3, 2025. A cost share of at least 5% of the award amount is required, and an in-kind cost share is allowable. Multiple awards are anticipated, with a maximum award amount of \$1.5 million. For early career investigator awards, the maximum amount is \$600,000.

Research Interests of the Air Force Office of Scientific Research - Broad Agency Announcement

Notice seeking proposals for basic research. The priority focus is on research areas that offer significant and comprehensive benefits to our national warfighting and peacekeeping capabilities. The two broad categories are engineering and information sciences, and physical and biological sciences.

Proposals can be submitted on a rolling basis. Multiple awards are anticipated, with award amounts ranging from \$100,000 to \$300,000 per year, for up to five years.

Verticals-enabling Intelligent Network Systems

Notice seeking proposals to support both fundamental research and verticals-driven technology development, demonstration, and translation activities that will lead to leaps in performance and capabilities of next generation (NextG) advanced intelligent network systems that span the user-edge-core-cloud continuum. The program seeks to go beyond the current research portfolios within individual participating NSF directorates and partner organizations by simultaneously emphasizing gains in performance and capabilities without compromising resilience and interoperability across all layers of the networking protocol and computation stacks. Innovations are sought across the various aspects of NextG communications, networking, and computing systems.

Proposals for track 1 and concept outlines are due August 25, 2025. Multiple awards are anticipated, and award amounts will vary depending on the track, ranging from \$1.5 million - \$6 million.
