U.S. Embassy Honduras – FY26 PDS Annual Program Statement

Notice seeking proposals to implement programs that promote U.S. priorities and strengthen ties between the United States and Honduras. U.S. priorities include advancing regional security, celebrating U.S. excellence tied to the 250th anniversary of U.S. independence, building regional economic prosperity, promoting use of U.S. science, technology, and innovation, and defending freedom of speech.

Proposals are due May 25, 2026. An estimated \$120,000 is available to fund three to five awards ranging from \$15,000 to \$40,000.

U.S. Embassy Sofia PDS Annual Program Statement

Notice seeking proposals for programs that strengthen the U.S.-Bulgaria partnership and advance U.S. administration priorities. Proposals must include a clear U.S. element, such as collaboration with American experts, organizations, or institutions, and should promote shared interests by strengthening cooperation in areas that advance security, economic growth, innovation, freedom of speech, countering censorship, and citizen diplomacy (people-to-people) ties. Competitive proposals should support Bulgaria as a sovereign, resilient, and economically strong partner and reinforce the role of the United States as a trusted ally and leader.

Proposals accepted on a rolling basis until June 15, 2026. Multiple awards are anticipated, ranging from \$5,000 to \$25,000.

Advancing Global Health

Notice seeking applications for projects to advance the America First Global Health Strategy, which aims to save lives, strengthen health systems, enhance efficiency, foster self-reliance, and ensure U.S. investments benefit American safety, strength, and prosperity. This Annual Program Statement establishes a supplemental framework through which the Department of State may identify and support projects that complement, extend, and/or fill identified gaps.

Statements of interest are received on a rolling basis until February 14., 2027. Addenda will include particular deadlines based on topic and region. Multiple awards are anticipated, ranging from \$500,000 to \$250,000,000.

BJA FY25 Comprehensive Opioid, Stimulant, and Substance Use Program (COSSUP) Investigations Training and Technical Assistance (TTA)

Notice seeking applications to support specialized TTA to COSSUP grantees with a particular focus on enhancements to strategic, operational, tactical, and other activities or resources that improve jurisdictions' approaches to reduce the unlawful distribution of illicit opioids and other substances, including but not limited support for law enforcement efforts to locate and investigate illicit activities.

Notice seeking applications to equip law enforcement and correctional officers with tactical skills and strategies to effectively de-escalate crisis situations, enhance safety, and protect officer wellbeing. Officers trained in crisis intervention techniques are better equipped to safely de-escalate volatile situations involving individuals experiencing behavioral health crises, including those with I/DDs.

Notice seeking proposals for Doctoral Dissertation Research Improvement Grants (DDRIGs) to the Arctic Sciences Section, Office of Polar Programs, to conduct dissertation-level research about and related to the Arctic region.
