Notes:

U. S. Dept of Education defines a cohort as that group of first-time, full-time, degree-seeking freshmen who enroll in a specific fall semester

The numbers shown on this report represent combined retention and graduation rates.

Retention and graduation rates are only for students whose academic levels are Freshman, Sophomore, Junior, or Senior.

This example shows how the data are calculated:

A student from the Fall 2004 cohort who returns as a Freshman, Sophomore, Junior, or Senior in Fall 2005 is counted in the "2nd Year" column.

If the student skips Fall 2006 and Fall 2007, the student is not counted in the "3rd Year" nor "4th Year" columns.

If the student returns as a Freshman, Sophomore, Junior, or Senior in Fall 2008, that student's retention is counted in the "5th Year" column.

If the student graduates with a Bachelor's Degree in any semester during the "6th Year" (consisting of Fall 2009, Spring 2010, and Summer 2010), the student's graduation is counted in the "6th Year" column.

If the student does not return to UNO in the 7th year, the student's past graduation from the 6th year is counted again in the 7th Year. The same applies for the 8th Year and 9th Year.

Retention rates are based on enrollment from one Fall semester to another Fall semester.

Graduation rates are based on the year in which students earn their first Bachelor's Degree. Each year consists of Fall, Spring, and Summer semesters.
