#### Overview

The M.F.A. program in Film and Theatre is accredited by the National Association of Schools of Theatre. Master of Fine Arts programs in Theatre Arts reflect NAST's highest standards. The Master of Fine Arts is a terminal degree for students interested in pursuing careers in film production, theatre arts, and in creative writing.

## **Program Objectives**

### M.F. A. Film and Theatre graduates will:

- Be able to identify important works in a historical context and analyze and critique the significant schools of thought of film theory.
- Demonstrate advanced skills in developing, producing, and have ready for exhibition a short narrative film.
- Demonstrate advanced knowledge of film production.
- Develop their acting/directing techniques.
- Be able to apply theory in written and oral form.
- Be able to apply knowledge of their specialty within the discipline of film.
- Learn creative skills in the art of theatre design.
- Demonstrate competency in a broad spectrum of theatre theory and production.
- Have a creative Film arts understanding.

### **Program Admission**

In addition to meeting the <u>minimum standards for admission to the Graduate</u> <u>School</u>, applicants to the program must provide evidence of their ability in their proposed concentration area either in the form of an audition or a portfolio of creative work.

#### **Program Requirements**

All M.S. Engineering students will complete 60 graduate credit hours. Students will be assessed for sufficient progress at the completion of 18 hours. At the completion

of 36 hours an oral and written comprehensive examination must be completed. All students will complete a publicly presented creative thesis.
